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A Few Words from Board Member, Tom Overton When Jon de Vos suddenly passed away on August 22nd, Indian Peaks lost its best friend.

Jon assumed the management of Indian Peaks in 1994, at a time when the resort was on the verge of collapse because its previous property manager had embezzled nearly a million dollars from the Indian Peaks owners. Through his diligence and hard work, he saved the investments of the owners and developed the resort into the financially sound jewel it is today. All of us owe Jon a debt of gratitude.

Jon was 71 years young. He grew up in Arizona, graduated from Arizona State and set out for Colorado. Jon landed in Winter Park 45 years ago and never left. The fact that Jon met his future wife Francie on the day of his arrival in Winter Park may have something to do with that. Jon pursued Francie relentlessly, and, after eight years, she finally succumbed. Jon and Francie were married in 1980. They were inseparable for the next 37 years.

In addition to being a certified property manager, Jon was a licensed master electrician, a real estate broker, and a father to a variety of pet birds and a houseful of dogs. Jon was also very active in the Grand County community. He served on the Housing Authority Board, the Fraser Valley Foundation and the Winter Park–Fraser Valley Chamber of Commerce. He volunteered for numerous non-profit organizations, including the Grand County Bowling Association. On top of all this, Jon found the time to be an award-winning humor writer for the

local newspapers. In 1996, Jon was selected as the Fraser Valley Citizen of the Year.

Jon will be sorely missed by his wife Francie, two dogs, three parrots, a brother, two sisters, two nephews, and numerous longtime friends.
